

"CABIN FEVER SHOOT"

February 27 and 28

The Ee Da How Long Rifles will be hosting the 2010 "Cabin Fever Shoot" for **Black Powder Cartridge Rifle Silhouette**. Don't let the winter weather drive you into "Cabin Fever"! Come to Boise, Idaho and shoot this match! We will shoot this match regardless of the weather; rain, snow, or 40 below! The only weather criteria will be visibility; we've got to be able to see the targets to shoot them! Sign up early because space is limited! The range will be open for practice starting at noon on Friday.

Target setters will be provided for the match.

Saturday Feb 27

Match 1 -40 shot match -Competitor's meeting at 9:00 a.m. with match to begin-immediately afterwards.

Sunday Feb 28

Match 2 -40 shot match- Competitor's meeting at 9:00 a.m. with match to begin immediately afterwards.

The course of fire for the matches will be:

- 10 Chickens from the offhand position ---- 200m
- 10 Pigs sitting or prone cross-sticks ----- 300m
- 10 Turkeys sitting or prone cross-sticks -- 385m
- 10 Rams sitting or prone cross-sticks ----- 500m

Entries and Fees:

The entry for the match is \$50 for adults, \$25 for junior shooters under 18. The fee includes awards, range fees, and target setting. Anyone not having a 2010 NRA Silhouette classification book will be required to buy a book at the match.

RIFLES & AMMUNITION:

Iron Sight BPCRS Rifles:

NRA Rules for equipment & ammunition will apply. Any safe, single shot, breech-loading rifle, of American design patent, produced prior to 1896 with an exposed hammer, original or reproduction, using metallic sights typical of the era. Maximum weight is 12 lbs. 2oz (15 lbs. with scope). Common rifles include the Sharps 1874, and 1877 models, Ballard, Remington Rolling Block and Hepburn models, Winchester and Browning models 1885, Stevens and Springfield Trapdoor models etc. Rifles must be chambered for cartridges of the American black powder era.

Ammunition:

Ammunition must be loaded with 100% black powder or Pyrodex only. Bullets may be cast or swaged and must be composed entirely of lead or lead alloy, lubricated or paper patched without gas checks. **The above is only a summary of the rules. A complete Rifle Silhouette Rule book can be obtained from the NRA.**
